II. ANALYSIS:

A. Purpose:

The purpose of this Act is to amend Tinian Local Law 23-7 to adjust the poker fee funds appropriated by the Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation.

B. Committee Findings:

Your Committee on Ways and Means, to which House Local Bill No. 23-43: "To amend Tinian Local Law 23-7; and for other purposes" was referred, examined and confirmed that the amount specified in the local appropriation Act is accurate and available for appropriation. The Committee received the Certification of Local Revenue-Tinian Poker Funds from the Department of Finance dated December 20, 2023, certifying the availability of funds in the amount of \$188,903.00. Therefore, your Committee recommends that House Local Bill No. 23-43 be transmitted to the Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation for action.

The Fund Certification has been attached as part of this committee report.

C. Legislative History:

House Local Bill 23-43 was introduced by Representative Patrick H. San Nicolas on March 28, 2024, and was subsequently referred to the House Standing Committee on Ways and Means for disposition.

III. CONCLUSION:

The Committee is content and confident with the certification of funds provided by the Department of Finance with respect to House Local Bill No. 23-43; therefore, it recommends that House Local Bill No. 23-43 be transmitted to the Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation for action.

A LOCAL APPROPRIATION BILL FOR AN ACT FOR THE SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT

To amend Tinian Local Law 23-7; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT DELEGATION PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 4, DIVISION 1, TITLE 1 OF THE COMMONWEALTH CODE:

1 SECTION 1. PURPOSE.

2 The purpose of this Act is to amend Tinian Local Law 23-7 to adjust the
3 poker fee funds appropriated by the Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation.

4 SECTION 2. AMENDMENTS.

- Notwithstanding any provision(s) of law, statutes, rules or regulations to the
 contrary, the Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation hereby amends Tinian
- 7 Local Law 23-7 as follows:

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- (A) The title is amended to read:
- 9 "To appropriate <u>\$188,903.00</u> \$208,000.00 from revenues collected
 10 from poker fees in the Second Senatorial District; and for other purposes."

1	(B)	Section 1 is amended to read:
2		"SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.
3		The purpose of this Act is to appropriate One Hundred
4		Eighty-Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Three dollars (\$188,903.00)
5		Two Hundred Twenty Four Thousand dollars (\$208,000.00 USD)
6		from revenues collected from poker fees in the Second Senatorial
7		District. The certification of funds was prepared on November 29,
8		2023, and was reviewed and confirmed by the Secretary of Finance.
9		This appropriation of local funds is not part of the FY 2024 Budget
10		Act. Therefore, this local appropriation of local poker fees does not
11		contravene 1 CMC § 7401 and 1 CMC § 7204(d) or any other
12		provision of the CNMI Budget Act."
13	(C)	Section 2 is amended to read:
14		"SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS.
15		Notwithstanding any provision(s) of law, statutes, rules or
16		regulations to the contrary and pursuant to funds allocated to the
17		Second Senatorial District from poker fees, the Tinian and Aguiguan
18		Legislative Delegation hereby appropriates <u>\$188,903.00</u>
19		\$208,000.00 of the revenues collected for the Second Senatorial
20		District from the poker fees as follows:
21		(A) <u>\$102,403.00</u> \$118,000.00 to the Mayor of Tinian and

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1	Aguiguan for operations, professional services and fees, and public				
2	programs.				
3	(B) \$40,000.00 to the Mayor of Tinian and Aguiguan				
4	discretionary account.				
5	(C) \$35,000.00 to the Tinian Municipal Scholarship				
6	Board.				
7	(D) $\$1,500.00$ $\$5,000.00$ to the Commonwealth Office of				
8	Transit Authority-Tinian.				
9	(E) \$10,000.00 to the Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative				
10	Delegation operations."				
11	SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.				
12	If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any				
13	person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction,				
14	the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or				
15	circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected				
16	thereby.				
17	SECTION 4. SAVINGS CLAUSE.				
18	This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as				
19	affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes				
20	repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers				
21	contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to				

prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in
 any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in
 existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

4 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

5 This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or it becoming

6 law without such approval.
