A BILL FOR AN ACT

To repeal and re-enact Public Law 22-22 in order to make revised appropriations for the operations and activities of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, its agencies, instrumentalities, and independent programs, and to provide revised budget authority for government corporations for the Fiscal Year 2023; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE 23RD NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

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1	CHAPTER I. PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS.
2	Section 101. Short Title. This Act may be cited as the "Revised
3	Appropriations and Budget Authority Act of 2023".
4	Section 102. Purpose. This Act appropriates local funds for the operations
5	and activities of the Government of the Northern Mariana Islands, its agencies,
6	instrumentalities, independent agencies, and political subdivisions, and provides
7	authority for government corporations for the Fiscal Year 2023 commencing April
8	16, 2023 and ending September 30, 2023.

I	CHAPTER IV. ADMINISTRATION OF APPROPRIATED FUNDS
2	Section 401. Management of Funds.
3	The expenditure of the funds appropriated and allocated under this Act shall
4	be regulated and controlled by the Secretary of Finance so that no agency,
5	department, instrumentality, program, or activity may expend the funds contrary to
6	the law or fiscal management policies and practices of the Commonwealth.
7	Provided further that, in addition to the report required under 1 CMC § 7209, the
8	Secretary of Finance shall submit within 30 calendar days at the end of each quarter,
9	a fund status report on the expenditures for personnel and operations of each
10	business unit funded in whole or in part by the General Fund for the quarter ended
11	and, if applicable, year-to-date totals as of the close of the reporting period.
12	Section 402. Number of Position(s) (NOP) Ceiling.
13	Employment Ceilings. Pursuant to Article X, § 7 of the Commonwealth
14	Constitution, the employment ceilings relative to the number of positions are
15	hereby established as set forth in this Act.
16	Section 403. Expenditure Authority.
17	The distribution and expenditure of funds shall be in compliance with the
18	fiscal expenditure authority that the listed agencies have pursuant to the statute and
19	the administrative provisions of this Act.

CHAPTER V. REPROGRAMMING AUTHORITY

Section 501. Reprogramming Authority

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Notwithstanding the 25% reprogramming authority pursuant to 1 CMC § 7402(b), the Governor shall have an additional 25% reprogramming authority for the departments, agencies, and offices of the executive branch. This authority to reprogram shall not apply to the funds appropriated to the Legislative or Judicial Branches as well as to those funds appropriated by the respective legislative delegations. Pursuant to 1 CMC § 7402(e), all reprogramming shall be reported in writing to the Presiding Officers of the Legislature, Chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means and the Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs within 30 days after the end of each quarter of the fiscal year. Such reports shall include a description of each item reprogrammed, the reason for each reprogramming, the change in the approved budget caused by the reprogramming, the cumulative amount of all reprogramming during the fiscal year, and such other information as may be requested by the Chairpersons. The Governor shall submit to the Presiding Officers and Chairpersons an annual summary of all reprogramming activity within 60 days after the end of a fiscal year.

Section 502. Deficit Reduction

Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Secretary of the Department of Finance shall establish an account for deficit reduction and may reprogram from any other executive branch account as needed for the purpose of deficit reduction.

6	utilities for the Legislative Branch shall be as shown in Schedule A.
7	(a) Notwithstanding 1 CMC §7204, without prior legislative approval, no
8	funds appropriated to the Legislature shall be reduced.
9	(b) Art. II Sec. 16(e) of the Commonwealth Constitution provides:
10	e) Beginning the second Monday of January 1998, the amount of the
11	ceiling and all other dollar amounts stated in this section shall be
12	adjusted every two years by the same percentage as the percentage
13	change in the United States Department of Commerce composite

Tenorio*, to wit: expenditure authority over resident departments that are primarily concerned with the delivery of public services can be revoked only on a prior showing of just cause, but the Governor has the discretion to revoke expenditure authority over those departments that are primarily concerned with enforcing the law.

1	(b) Of the five NOPs allotted to Finance & Accounting - Rota, BU 1112,
2	one NOP shall be set aside to employ an Account Clerk I.
3	(c) The increased NOPs allotted to the First Senatorial District shall be as

21	appropriations to the Municipal Council shall be under the expenditure authority of

1 the Municipal Council Chairperson. Additionally, in accord with the Superior 2 Court's decision in the case of *Inos v. 19	(a) Northern Marianas College. The President of the Northern Marianas
20	College or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the funds under BU 1605.

1	(b) NMC Board of Regents. The Chairperson of the Board of Regents of the
2	Northern Marianas College or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the
3	appropriated funds under BU 1627.
4	(c) Public School System. The Commissioner of Education or designee
5	shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds under BU 1607. Funds
6	appropriated to PSS shall not be used for personnel and operations of the Board of
7	Education.
8	(d) Board of Education. The Chairperson of the Board of Education or
9	designee shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds under BU
10	1624. The funds appropriated to the Board of Education shall include the cost and
11	expenses of the student and teacher representatives to the Board of Education.
12	(e) CNMI Medical Referral Program (Health Network Program). The
13	Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation shall administer the CNMI Medical
14	Referral Program or its successor, including both inter-island and off-island
15	referrals, consistent with its duties and responsibilities under 3 CMC § 2821 et seq.
16	More specifically, the inter-island medical referral services shall include stipends,
17	airfare, and lodging for patients and escorts, which is consistent with the off-island
18	medical referral program. The expenditure authority for all funds appropriated or
19	allocated to inter-island and off-island medical referral services and administration
20	(inclusive of BU 1979, 1979A, and any new business units established for CHCC

1 Medical Referral) shall be the CEO of the Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation or designee. 2 3 (f) Northern Marianas Technical Institute. The Chairperson of the Board of 4 Trustees or designee in consultation with the Chief Executive Officer shall be the 5 expenditure authority of the appropriated funds for the Northern Marianas 6 Technical Institute. 7 Section 710. Independent Programs. 8 The revised FY 2023 budget appropriation for the agencies under this 9 section shall be as shown in Schedule A. 10 (a) Joeten-Kiyu Public Library. The Chairperson of the Commonwealth 11 Library Council or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the allocated 12 funds. 13 (b) NMI Museum of History and Culture. The Chairperson of the Board of 14 Governors of the NMI Museum of History and Culture or designee shall be the 15 expenditure authority of the appropriated funds. 16 (c) Elected Attorney General. The Attorney General or designee shall be the 17 expenditure authority of the appropriated funds. Notwithstanding any law to the 18 contrary, the Office of the Attorney General may charge fees for legal services 19 provided to CNMI public corporations and autonomous agencies; provided that the 20 Office of the Attorney General shall not charge fees for legal services provided to 21 divisions, offices, and line agencies within the executive branch with the exception

- 1 of the Department of Public Lands, the Division of Revenue and Taxation, the
- 2 Bureau of Environmental and Coastal Quality, and the Office of Management and
- 3 Budget. The increased NOPs allotted to the Elected Attorney General BU 1519
- 4 shall be as indicated in Schedule A.
- 5 (d) The expenditure authority of the funds appropriated for the Public
- 6 Assistance Program shall be the Governor's Authorized Representative.
- 7 (e) Medicaid Program. The funds appropriated in this Act for the Medicaid
- 8 Program, including Medicaid Reimbursement, BU 1951, Medicaid Agency, BU

7	within 30 days after the end of each month beginning March 31, 2023.
8	Section 713. Access Provided to Legislature.
9	Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, current "read only"
10	access shall be provided to the Speaker of the House and the Senate President of
11	the CNMI Legislature and their designees, the Fiscal Analysts, for budgetary
12	purposes at a level equal to that of the CNMI Office of Management and Budget.
13	Provided that said access shall also be available consistent with the following:
14	(A) the Munis Financial Management Information System or other
15	financial and accounting system to obtain the following: monthly
16	collections and expenditures, including but not limited to funds status, and
17	detailed expenditure reports in a format that is exportable or convertible to
18	Excel files; and
19	(B) the following reports in a format that is exportable or convertible
20	to Excel files shall be provided to the CNMI Legislative Fiscal Analysts 30
21	days after the effective date of this Act:

1	(i) All revolving accounts;

5	(iv) All debt service payments, including payments to the
6	Settlement Fund, and Series A and Series B Funds;
7	(v) All revenue accounts in the First, Second, and Third
8	Senatorial Districts that are identified as budgetary resources in the
9	Budget Authority Act;
10	(C) Any other financial information, not legally privileged or protected,
11	relating to the CNMI Government's expenditure of public funds, as needed and
12	requested, in writing, within 10 days of said request.
13	CHAPTER VIII. OUTSIDE SOURCES
14	Section 801. Administrative Provisions.
15	(a) Notwithstanding 1 CMC § 7204, the outside source funds appropriated
16	for FY 2023 shall be allotted monthly; except programs that require one-time
17	payments may receive advance allotments.
18	(b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Secretary of Finance shall
19	submit to the presiding officers of the Legislature, at the end of each quarter, a fund
20	status report on the outside-sourced funds that are transferred in and out of

1 government business units and their respective accounts, pursuant to Section 802 of this Act. 2 3 (c) All salaries of elected officials that are waived under 1 CMC § 8442 4 shall be transferred by the Secretary of Finance to the Scholarship Trust Account 5 and the funds from the account shall be spent for scholarship purposes only, without 6 further appropriation, and without fiscal year limitation. 7 Section 802. Outside Sources. 8 (a) Tobacco Settlement Funds. Pursuant to 3 CMC §2173 and the funds 9 allocated in this section pursuant to the submittal of a program and expenditure plan 10 to the Secretary of Finance, the Tobacco Settlement funds in the amount of 11 \$540,000, not subject to reprogramming or fiscal year limitation, shall be allocated 12 as follows: 13 (1) Division of Public Health 40%: \$216,000 14 (2) Public School System 20%: \$108,000 15 (3) Youth Affairs Office 12.5%: \$67,500 16 (4) Coalition of Private Schools 7.5%: \$40,500 17 (5) Rota Mayor 10%: \$54,000 18 (6) Tinian and Aguiguan Mayor 10%: \$54,000 19 The expenditure authorities of the funds allocated pursuant to this 20 Section 802(a) shall be the persons authorized by law for each respective office or 21 agency. The expenditure authorities shall provide accountability and transparency

1	by providing within 30 days after the end of each quarter an expenditure report of
2	the funds to the governor and the presiding officers of the Legislature.
3	(b) Compact Impact. The Compact Impact fund in the amount of
4	\$1,983,455 shall be allocated in accordance with relevant data submitted by the
5	affected agencies.
6	(c) Commonwealth Worker Fund (Source: U.S.P.L. 115-218).
7	In accordance with U.S. Public Law 115-218, the sum of \$1,500,000 in
8	Commonwealth Worker Fee Funds shall be available for the sole and exclusive
9	purpose of funding vocational education, apprenticeships, or other training
10	programs for United States workers by Commonwealth educational entities for
11	FY 2023. Provided that out of the \$1,500,000, the following amounts shall be
12	allocated for the sole and exclusive purpose of funding vocational education,
13	apprenticeships, or other vocational training programs for United States workers.
14	CHAPTER IX. GENERAL PROVISIONS
15	Section 901. Severability. If any provision of this Act, or its application to
16	any person or circumstance, is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other
17	provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid
18	provision or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
19	Section 902. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein
20	shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or
21	acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted
