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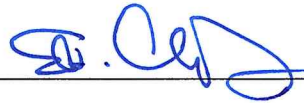

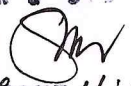

Governor Apatang declared a State of Significant Emergency in response to Tropical Storm Sinlaku (04W), then forecast to intensify into a Category 3 or 4 typhoon threatening Saipan, Tinian, and Rota. Activated the State Emergency Operations Plan and authorized mobilization of all available resources under 1 CMC § 20144.

GOV. COMM. 24-143: (5/11/2026) **Executive Order No. 2026-006** — *Renewal of State of Significant Emergency* Issued May 11, 2026. Following Super Typhoon Sinlaku's devastating Category 4 landfall, EO 2026-006 renewed the emergency declaration for an additional 30 days to support ongoing repair of power, water, transportation, and communications infrastructure. HSEM retains primary authority through the EOC.

GOV. COMM. 24-144: (5/11/2026) **Executive Order No. 2026-007** — *CUC Emergency Procurement Authorization* Issued May 2026. Following Super Typhoon Sinlaku's devastation of the CNMI from April 13-16, 2026, EO 2026-007 expressly authorized the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation to enter into expedited contracts for restoration of power, water, and wastewater services.
