A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend P.L. 10-17 (the Commonwealth Disaster Price Freeze Act) to include housing and shelter on the list of items whose prices may be frozen in the event of an emergency or disaster.

1	Section 1. Findings. The Legislature finds that there is a problem with
2	sudden increases in the price of housing or shelter during a typhoon or
3	similar emergency. P.L. 10-17 imposes serious penalties on "price gouging" of
4	food, tools, and other useful items during a typhoon or other emergency, but it
5	did not address this issue. The purpose of this bill is to correct this oversight.
6	Section 2. Amendment. Subsection (c) of Section (3) of Public Law 10-17
7	is hereby amended by the addition of a subsection (9), to read as follows:
8	"9) Apartment rentals, charges for storage or shelter, or hotel room
9	rates."
10	Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application
11	of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by
12	a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application
13	of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is
14	held invalid shall not be affected thereby.
15	Section 4. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein
16	shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract
17	or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order

adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any 1 2 proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any 3 liability civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence at the date this 4 5 Act becomes effective. A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend 4 CMC §5141 et seq. (the Commonwealth Disaster Price Freeze Act) to include housing, storage and shelter on the list of items whose prices may be frozen in the event of an emergency or disaster.

1	Section 1. Findings. The Legislature finds that there is a problem with sudden
2	increases in the price of housing, storage, and shelter during a typhoon or similar
3	emergency. 4 CMC §5141 et seq. imposes penalties on "price gouging" of food, tools,
4	and other useful items during a typhoon or other emergency but does not address this
5	issue. The purpose of this bill is to correct this oversight by adding housing, shelter, and
6	storage to items subject to a price freeze and increases the penalties to reflect the severity
7	of the crime.
8	Section 2. New Subsection; Prize Freeze Items Added. Amend 4 CMC §5142(c)
9	by inserting after subsection (8) the following new subsection:
10	"9) Apartment rentals, charges for storage or shelter, or hotel room rates ."
11	Section 3. Applicability. Amend 4 CMC §5142 by inserting after subsection (d)
12	the following new subsection:
13	"(e) Applicability. 4 CMC §5142(c)(9) shall apply only to persons who
14	are legal holders of business licenses and conduct an apartment, storage, or shelter
15	rental or hotel business."
16	Section 4. Price Freeze Item: Designation Clarified. Amend 4 CMC §5142(c)(5)
17	to read as follows:
18	"(5) Generators, cables, wires, electrical batteries of every sort, and similar
9	equipment for the generation and/or transmission of electrical power."

Section 6. Penalties Increased. amend 4 CMC §5143 to read as follows: 1 2 §5143. Penalties. 3 Any person who sells, or presents for sale, an item whose price has been raised while a price freeze was in effect, shall be guilty of a felony, and shall be 4 subject to a penalty of not more than \$10,000 or six months of imprisonment, or 5 6 both. 7 Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application of any 8 such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of 9 competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to 10 persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected 11 thereby. 12 Section 6. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not 13 be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under 14 statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. 15 Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or 16 pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, 17 or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in 18 existence at the date this Act becomes effective. 19 Section 7. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the 20 Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
