

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend 2 CMC § 5201(a), to require all parties to a permit to visit Aguiguan register with the Division of Fish and Wildlife prior to and immediately after all landings on Aguiguan; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TWELFTH NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

- 1 Section 1. “Restrictions on Landing on Aguiguan.
2 (a) No aircraft or personal landings on the island of Aguiguan shall be allowed
3 without first obtaining the written permission of the Mayor of Tinian and
4 Aguiguan, and such landings shall be subject to any reasonable and
5 nondiscriminatory condition stated in the permit, **specifically including a**
6 **requirement that all parties to the permit must register with the Division**
7 **of Fish and Wildlife both prior to departure and immediately upon**
8 **return from Aguiguan.**
9 (b) Any existing law or ordinance not consistent with this section is hereby
10 repealed.
11 Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application of any
12 such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of
13 competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to
14 persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected
15 thereby.
16 Section 3. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not
17 be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under

1 statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes.
2 Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or
3 pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating,
4 or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in
5 existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

6 Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the
7 Governor or its becoming law without such approval.
