AN ACT

TO AMEND THE APPROPRIATIONS ACT OF FISCAL YEAR 2022 (PUBLIC LAW 22-08) TO ESTABLISH A BUSINESS UNIT FOR RETIREES' BONUS AND TO REAPPROPRIATE PERSONNEL LAPSES WITHIN DEPARTMENTS AND LINE-ITEM VETOES WITHIN PUBLIC LAW 22-08 TO FUND THE RETIREES' BONUS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Bill was referred not referred to a House Committee.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, MARCH 29, 2022; without amendments and transmitted to THE SENATE.

The Bill was referred to the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE SENATE ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, APRIL 18, 2022; with amendments in the form of H. B. No. 22-95, SS1 and returned to the House of Representatives on April 19, 2022.

The House of Representatives accepted the Senate amendments and passed H. B. No. 22-95, SS1, during its 2nd Day, First Special Session on April 27, 2022.

AN ACT

TO AMEND THE APPROPRIATIONS ACT OF FISCAL YEAR 2022 (PUBLIC LAW 22-08) TO ESTABLISH A BUSINESS UNIT FOR RETIREES' BONUS AND TO REAPPROPRIATE PERSONNEL LAPSES WITHIN DEPARTMENTS AND LINEITEM VETOES WITHIN PUBLIC LAW 22-08 TO FUND THE RETIREES' BONUS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TWENTY-SECOND NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

Retirees of the CNMI government are members of the community who have dedicated their lives working for the betterment of the Commonwealth. Many government retirees depend heavily on the fixed incomes that their pensions provide, which are not subject to adjustments with inflation or the impacts of disaster, pandemic, or other calamity. Like Senate Joint Resolution 22-05, the purpose of this Act is to assist CNMI government retirees in

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meeting needs caused or exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic. This appropriation bill, however, reappropriates two million six hundred twenty-six thousand dollars (\$2,626,000) in local funds from sources that are clearly identified, including provisions that were originally passed by both the House of Representatives and the Senate but line item vetoed by the governor.

The Legislature finds that the Secretary of the Department of Finance transmitted a letter to Senate President Jude U. Hofschneider on April 14, 2022 identifying general fund personnel lapses within departments and line-item vetoes within Public Law 22-08 for a total amount of \$2,626,000 to reappropriate to fully and properly fund the retirees' bonus of \$1,000. The Legislature further finds that reappropriating identified general fund personnel lapses and line-item vetoes within Public Law 22-08 is the more responsible approach to funding the retirees' bonuses instead of arbitrarily selecting business units within Public Law 22-08 without considering the adverse consequences to the department affected by such arbitrary reappropriation.

Moreover, through this legislation, the Legislature shows its appreciation and support for CNMI government retirees in a fiscally responsible manner. During this economic slump as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, where tourist arrivals have dropped drastically and tax collections are significantly reduced, General Fund resources are extremely limited. While ARPA funds can be used to supplement the Commonwealth's local budget, the Legislature is mindful that these federal funds must not be misused. By redirecting local funds to pay the retiree bonus, including local funds that were originally appropriated for provisions that the

governor vetoed, this Act minimizes the risk of potential ARPA violations and protects the Commonwealth's continued access to nearly half a billion dollars in ARPA money.

Based on the foregoing, the Legislature hereby amends the Fiscal Year 2022 budget act (Public Law 22-08) by reappropriating funds that were line item vetoed, specifically Section 703(d)(1)(A), Section 704(c), and the Micronesian Legal Services (B.U. 1580) in Schedule A; and by reappropriating general fund lapsed personnel funds from various department business units as identified in the amended Schedule A to appropriate two million six hundred twenty-six thousand dollars (\$2,626,000) to assist CNMI government retirees, and establishes a new business unit dedicated solely for the benefit of government retirees, from which the retiree bonus will be paid.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.

Section 103(c)(8) of Public Law 22-08 is hereby amended by adding one new business unit as follows:

"NEW Retirees' Bonus"

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.

Section 710 of Public Law 22-08 is hereby amended by adding a new subsection (g) and renumbering the remaining section to read as follows:

"(g) Retirees' Bonus. The retirees' bonus shall be distributed equally to all Settlement Class Members and CNMI Fund members receiving an annuity. The Secretary of Finance or his/her designee shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds.

(h) For programs and activities not specifically mentioned, the expenditure authority shall be the Secretary of Finance."

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.

Schedules A & C of Public Law 22-08 are hereby amended as reflected in the attached schedules, by reappropriating funds that were line item vetoed, specifically Section 703(d)(1)(A), Section 704(c), and the Micronesian Legal Services (B.U. 1580) in Schedule A; and by reappropriating general fund lapsed personnel funds from various department business units as identified in the amended Schedule A.

Accordingly, two million six hundred twenty-six thousand dollars (\$2,626,000) shall be appropriated to the Retirees' Bonus business unit as established in Section 2. The retirees' bonus shall be distributed equally to all Settlement Class Members and CNMI Fund members receiving an annuity. The expenditure authority of said funds shall be the Secretary of Finance.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.

If any provisions of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 6. SAVINGS CLAUSE.

This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation, or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not

have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor, or its becoming law without such approval.
