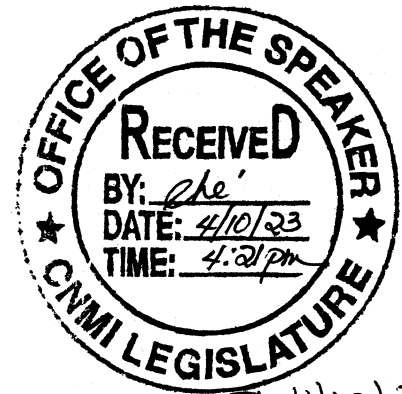

**TO AMEND 4 CMC § 8112 TO PRIORITIZE NET METERING TO
INCLUDE PUBLIC LIBRARIES; AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES.**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE TWENTY-THIRD NORTHERN
MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:**

SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

1 The Legislature finds that Public Law 18-75 found that the only way to reduce utility
2 costs was to utilize renewable energy sources to offset the electricity or other utility required
3 for the operations of the Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation and the Public School
4 System. Accordingly, the purpose of Public Law 18-75 was to provide a definition for net
5 metering and to prioritize the interconnection with net metering for health and education
6 renewable energy capacity at the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation. In addition, any
7 reasonable direct expense to CUC for reviewing and interconnecting the PV or wind power
8 renewable energy capacity shall be the responsibility of CHCC and PSS and that there would
9 be no cost to CUC to prioritize the interconnection of the renewable energy. Over time, CHCC
10 and PSS will save millions of dollars in utility costs and utilize the money saved for other
11 essential needs of the public health and education entities.

HOUSE BILL 23-6

1 Accordingly, the intent of this Act is to include public libraries as an education entity
2 for net metering and to prioritize the interconnection with net metering for renewable energy
3 capacity at the CUC. In addition, including public libraries in the definition of education
4 entities, will allow the entity to qualify and apply for federal grants that support the
5 Administration's priorities for clean energy to power the future in the U.S. territories as part of
6 the larger efforts towards energy security in America.

7 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.**

8 Title 4, Division 8, Chapter 1, Article 1 § 8112 (e) and (g) of the Commonwealth Code
9 are hereby amended to read as follows:

10 “(e) “Health and education renewable energy capacity” means a renewable
11 capacity that is located on the premises of a public health entity or education entity,
12 including public libraries; operated in parallel with the utility's transmission and
13 distribution facilities; in conformance with the utility's interconnection requirements;
14 and intended primarily to offset part or all of the electrical requirements of the health
15 and education government agencies;

16 (g) “Net metering” means measuring the difference between the electricity
17 supplied through the electrical grid and the electricity generated by an eligible entity
18 and fed back to the electric grid over a monthly billing period; provided that net energy
19 metering shall be accomplished using one or more meters capable of registering the
20 flow of electricity in two directions and any additional metering shall be used only to
21 provide the information necessary to accurately bill or credit the public health entity or
22 education entity;”

23 **SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.**

24 If any provisions of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or
25 circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this
26 Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which
27 it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

28 **SECTION 4. SAVINGS CLAUSE.**

29 This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any
30 existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule,

1 regulation, or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect
2 any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not
3 have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which
4 shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

5 **SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.**


6 This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor, or it becoming law without


