

A SENATE RESOLUTION

Respectfully urging the nomination of Jose Camacho Tenorio (Joeten) for induction into the "Commonwealth Hall of Fame" for his extraordinary and meritorious contributions towards the development of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Island.

1 WHEREAS, in 1949, Jose Camacho Tenorio established his
2 first business enterprise, a "Mom and Pop" store in the village
3 of Chalan Kanoa, Saipan; and

4 WHEREAS, in the following years the store, with the diligent
5 help and support of his wife, Soledad Takai Tenorio, continued
6 to grow and eventually expanded to its second location in Susupe
7 Village, Beach Road, Saipan; and eventually to a third store
8 in Garapan, Saipan; and

9 WHEREAS, in 1956, Jose Camacho Tenorio established the
10 first shipping line in the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands
11 which still operates today, more than three decades after its
12 founding; and

13 WHEREAS, Jose Camacho Tenorio was one of the founders of
14 the Saipan Chamber of Commerce in the late 1950's and sought
15 to protect the interests of the local business community as
16 well as initiate various community aid and sports activities;
17 and

18 WHEREAS, always interested in economic development,
19 Jose Camacho Tenorio, in 1966 won the Trust Territory Government
20 contract to engage in the buying and selling of copra for all
21 of Micronesia through the United Micronesian Development

1 Association which is still very active in commerce and
2 merchandising throughout all of the islands today; and

3 WHEREAS, during the late 1950's, at the urging of a
4 resolution of the Saipan Chamber of Commerce, the Trust
5 Territory Government Headquarters was finally moved to the
6 island of Saipan in 1962, which marked one of the first step
7 towards economic development for the island; and

8 WHEREAS, in 1968 the United Micronesian Development
9 Association, together with Continental Airlines, formed the
10 joint venture known as Air Micronesia, which remains the
11 largest air carrier throughout the islands today; and

12 WHEREAS, other commercial enterprises founded by
13 Jose Camacho Tenorio during his active business career included
14 insurance, a stevedoring operation, a bus company, a bowling
15 center, an automobile dealership, car rental and poultry farm;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, Jose Camacho Tenorio was a charter member and
18 assisted in the establishment of the Ponape Agricultural and
19 Trade School (PATS); and

20 WHEREAS, Jose Camacho Tenorio was a member of the Mariana
21 Islands Political Status Commission, which negotiated the
22 Covenant to Establish a Commonwealth in Political Union with
23 the United States of America; and

24 WHEREAS, Jose Camacho Tenorio is a symbolic man of great
25 distinction and over the years has continually made generous

1 donations for religious, state and other charitable and
2 humanitarian purposes; and

3 WHEREAS, House Resolution No. 75 adopted on July 1, 1980,
4 conveyed sincerer thanks and appreciation to Joeten Enterprises
5 for its generous contributions in the Northern Mariana Islands;
6 and

7 WHEREAS, House Resolution No. 8 adopted on February 11, 1982,
8 commended Jose Camacho Tenorio for his outstanding leadership
9 and service to the people of the Commonwealth of the Northern
10 Marianas; and

11 WHEREAS, due to his successful endeavors, Jose Camacho
12 Tenorio has been featured in a number of business magazines
13 and other publications in recent years; and

14 WHEREAS, in May 25, 1986, Jose Camacho Tenorio was again
15 recognized and honored in being selected to become the first
16 resident of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Island
17 to recieve and honor a Doctorate of Law Degree from the University
18 of Guam; and

19 WHEREAS, Public Law 3-46 established the "Commonwealth
20 Hall of Fame" recognizing men of exemplary achievements who
21 have excelled or made extraordinary and meritorious contributions
22 to the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; now therefore.

23 BE IT RESOLVED that the Commission of the Commonwealth
24 Hall of Fame empower a Select Committee on Nominations to
25 nominate Jose Camacho Tenorio to the Commonwealth Hall of Fame

1 for his extraordinary and meritorious contributions to the
2 development of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Island;
3 and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the Senate
5 shall certify and the Legislative Clerk shall attest to the
6 adoption hereof and thereafter transmit certified copies to the
7 Commonwealth Hall of Fame Commission, to the Mayor of Rota, to
8 the Mayor of Tinian and Aguiguan; to the Mayor of Saipan, the
9 Mayor of the islands north of Saipan, to the Speaker of the House
10 of Representatives and to the Governor Pedro P. Tenorio.

Dear Mr. President:

The Administration is in receipt of Senate Resolution 5-35, entitled, "Respectfully urging the nomination of Jose Camacho Tenorio (Joeten) for induction into the "Commonwealth Hall of Fame" for his extraordinary and meritorious contributions towards the development of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands," which was adopted by the Senate and transmitted on February 9, 1987.

AN ACT

To establish a Northern Marianas Hall of Fame to be known as the
"Commonwealth Hall of Fame."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

1 Section 1. Legislative Finding. In the emergence of the Northern
2 Marianas as a viable community, there were exemplary achievements, acts
3 and deeds by men and women, young and old, indigenous and non-indigenous,
4 which contributed to making what the Northern Marianas is today. These
5 achievements, acts and deeds, in many cases, are now part of the
6 Commonwealth's history, tradition or heritage worthy of public
7 recognition and deserve to be memorialized in a fitting manner for
8 the present and future generations. Therefore, a means should be
9 devised through which appropriate honor and recognition can be
10 officially conferred and preserved for posterity.

11 It is the wish of the people of the Northern Marianas that there
12 shall be established a hall of fame to be known as the "Commonwealth
13 Hall of Fame" which shall serve as an official repository for public
14 recognition, honor and awards accorded such persons whose exemplary,
15 distinguished or meritorious acts, deeds or achievements have, in some
16 way, contributed, enriched or enhanced the history, culture, heritage
17 or the social, political or economic development of the Northern
18 Marianas.

19 It is the intent of the Legislature that the criteria for induction
20 into the Commonwealth Hall of Fame be of the highest standards. A
21 person may be inducted into the Commonwealth Hall of Fame only after

1 he or she has met certain criteria.

2 Section 2. Commonwealth Hall of Fame Commission Establishment of.

3 (a) There is hereby established a Commonwealth Hall of Fame
4 Commission which shall consist of 9 voting members, to be appointed
5 as follows: one shall be appointed by the Mayor of Saipan; one shall
6 be appointed by the Mayor of Rota; one shall be appointed by the
7 Mayor of Tinian and Aguiguan; one shall be appointed by the Mayor
8 of the islands north of Saipan; one shall be appointed by the
9 President of the Senate; one shall be appointed by the Speaker of
10 the House of Representatives; and one shall be appointed by the
11 Governor. In addition, the Director of Community and Cultural
12 Affairs and the Special Assistant for Carolinian Affairs shall
13 be members of the Commission. Members of the Commission may be
14 removed by the appointing officials with or without cause.
15 The membership of the Commission shall be exempt from the
16 provisions of Section 1(g) of Title I (a) of Public Law 1-8.

17 (b) Members of the Commission shall serve a term of 4
18 years. Each member to be eligible for appointment shall also
19 (1) have resided in the Northern Marianas for at least 5 years;
20 (2) have demonstrated knowledge of the culture and history of
21 the Northern Marianas, past and present; and (3) must be of good
22 character. The Chairman shall be elected by a majority vote of
23 the members of the Commission. A Vice-Chairman and Secretary
24 shall be elected in like manner.

25

1 Section 3. Commonwealth Hall of Fame Commission: Meetings. The
2 meetings of the Commission shall be open to the public and shall be
3 held at least once every 3 months. Special meetings may be called by
4 the Chairman or upon the affirmative vote of 6 members.

5 Section 4. Commonwealth Hall of Fame Commission: Acts. The
6 affirmative vote of 6 members of the Board shall be necessary for
7 the validity of any of its acts.

8 Section 5. Commonwealth Hall of Fame Commission: Compensation.
9 Members of the Commission shall serve without pay but shall be
10 reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the
11 performance of their duties as certified by the Chairman.

12 Section 6. Commonwealth Hall of Fame Commission: Rules and
13 regulations. The Commission shall promulgate reasonable rules and
14 regulations for the administration of its operations.

15 Section 7. Eligible Nomination: Categories. The Commission
16 shall accept nominations of persons for induction into the
17 "Commonwealth Hall of Fame" who have excelled or made extraordinary
18 and meritorious contributions to the Northern Marianas in their fields
19 of endeavor from any of the following categories:

- 20 (a) medicine and health;
21 (b) youth (persons under 25 years of age);
22 (c) senior citizens (persons 55 years of age and over);
23 (d) business, commerce, tourism and economic development;
24 (e) arts and sciences;
25 (f) athletics and sports;

-
- 1 (g) law and government;
2 (h) education and training;
3 (i) community, civic and religious affairs;
4 (j) Chamorro and Carolinian languages and cultural affairs;
5 (k) farmers and fishermen;
6 (l) adults (persons 26 years through 54 years of age); and
7 (m) other worthy causes and/or persons as determined by
8 the Commission.

9 Section 8. Nominations. Nominations for any of the categories
10 of endeavor stated in Section 7 shall be governed by the following
11 rules:

12 (a) Except as provided in Section 11 of this Act,
13 nominations shall be made by petition by no less than 100 persons
14 who are registered voters of the Northern Marianas; such nomination
15 may be initiated by an organized civic or fraternal group in the
16 Northern Marianas or by a group of residents who ban together for
17 such purpose.

18 (b) The nomination shall be accompanied by a typewritten
19 resume including a biography and a detailed description of the
20 accomplishment(s) for which the person is being nominated.

21 Section 9. Screening and Induction.

22 (a) Screening. The Commission shall screen the nominating
23 petition and its accompanying data and select not more than
24 3 finalists from each category for consideration. It may
25 require the finalists, if living, and other relevant persons

1 to appear, as necessary, before the Commission. The Commission
2 shall not ask questions that would be violative of the potential
3 inductee's right to privacy, but the Commission may make pertinent
4 inquiries relative to the award for which the person is being
5 considered for induction.

6 (b) Every finalist shall have made extraordinary and
7 meritorious contributions or achievements towards the development
8 of the Northern Marianas.

9 (c) Every finalist shall have made contributions or
10 achievement which clearly singles him out over all others in
11 the same field or category.

12 (d) The extraordinary and meritorious contributions or
13 achievements made by the person nominated shall be judged on
14 the basis of their importance, effectiveness, and impact on
15 the well-being of the Northern Marianas.

16 (e) Induction. The affirmative vote of 9 members of the
17 Commission shall be necessary for the induction of any nominee
18 into the Commonwealth Hall of Fame.

19 (f) The Commission shall induct each confirmed nominee
20 into the "Commonwealth Hall of Fame" in a ceremony on the eighth
21 of December of each year or at such time and place as it deems
22 appropriate.

23 Section 10. Staffing: Subject to Budget Limitations. The
24 Commission is authorized to use or employ such staff as may be
25 necessary to carry out the purpose of this Act. The employees shall

1 be employees on loan from the Department of Community and Cultural
2 Affairs or hired by the Commission as classified employees consistent
3 with the rules and regulations adopted by the Commission; PROVIDED,
4 however, that the Director shall be appointed by the Commission with
5 the advice and consent of the Senate; PROVIDED, further that the
6 Director may be removed by the affirmative vote of 6 members of the
7 Commission. The Director may exercise such authority as the
8 Commission delegates to him. The Commission shall be an independent
9 agency of the Commonwealth Government.

10 Section 11. Select Committee. The Commission may empower a
11 Select Committee on Nominations composed of 5 members of the Commission
12 which may nominate eligible persons to supplement nominations by
13 petition under Section 8 of this Act for induction into the
14 "Commonwealth Hall of Fame."

15 Section 12. Special Provisions. In addition to Section 7 of
16 this Act, the Commission may recognize those persons whose achievements,
17 acts and deeds have contributed to the overall development of the
18 Commonwealth and shall be fittingly bestow public honor in the
19 "Commonwealth Hall of Fame" for posterity. Such persons may include:

20 (a) former Governors and Lieutenant Governors of the
21 Commonwealth;


22 (b) former members of the District Legislature,
23 Congress of Micronesia and the Municipal Councils;


24 (c) Members of the Commonwealth law enforcement
25 agency killed in the line of duty;

- 1 (d) former Washington Representatives;
2 (e) former judges of the Commonwealth judicial system;
3 (f) former Commissioners and Mayors;
4 (g) former Constitutional Convention delegates; and
5 (h) former members of the Northern Marianas Commonwealth
6 Legislature.


7 Section 13. Inscription. "Commonwealth Hall of Fame." The name
8 of each inductee shall be inscribed on a bronze or similarly appropriate
9 plaque to be publicly displayed in the "Commonwealth Hall of Fame."
10 Each person inducted shall receive a medal commemorative of the occasion.


11 Section 14. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its
12 approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.






