
The Honorable Ralph DLG. Torres has served as the 9th Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands since December 29, 2015.

Fiscal Year 2022

The CNMI's Appropriations and Budget Authority Act of 2022 authorized the total identified budgetary resources for FY 2022 at \$144,848,801. After calculated adjustments as per Chapter II, Section 201 of the CNMI Appropriations and Budget Authority Act of 2022, Governor Torres signed the \$103,384,323 FY 2022 budget bill into Public Law 22-08.

Rebuilding Our Tourism Industry
