The Commonwealth Office of Transit Authority (COTA) was established by CNMI Public Law 17-43 on May 27, 2011. COTA is responsible for the development and establishment of a public transportation system in the Commonwealth.

COTA is administered by a Special Assistant for Public Transportation who is appointed by the Governor and serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

COTA has a six-member Commonwealth Public Transportation Advisory Board established by Public Law 18-51.

Performance and Progress

Demand Responsive Shared Rider Service, Call-A-<u>Ride Saipan (CARS)</u>


COTA's Call-A- Ride Saipan (CARS) Demand Responsive Shared Ride Service provides accessible transportation to persons with disabilities, senior citizens (ages 55 and above) and to the general public.

The bar graph on the right shows the significant increase of 30.93% in ridership for FY2023 which shows the growing need for public transportation on the island of Saipan.

CARS is a reservation based, curb-to-curb, and door to door service that is offered to anyone on the island. All riders must call one (1) to two (2) days in advance for reservations.

Fixed Route

The Commonwealth Office of Transit Authority (COTA) Fixed Route service conveniently provides transportation to the general public throughout the island using a set schedule and established routes with fixed bus stops. COTA's Fixed Route system is currently under assessment as some bus stops have been uprooted due to the ongoing construction works along Beach Road, Saipan.




There is a 30.93% increase in ridership for FY2023.

This route will allow the community including tourist to have easier access to hotels, restaurants, shopping centers, etc.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS


- On October 2022, COTA employees underwent the Certified for PASS (Passenger Assistance, Safety and Sensitivity) Training.
- On December 2022, COTA provided 300 student vouchers to the Northern Marianas College (NMC), Northern Marianas Technical Institute (NMTI), and CNMI Public School System (PSS).
- Successfully procured ten (10) new ADA accessible transit buses through a competitive federal grant for 1.9 million dollars to support its fixed-route service. All 10 buses were delivered on June 2023.
- On August 28, 2023 to August 30, 2023, COTA participated in the Marianas Visitors Authority (MVA) Korea Roadshow.
- On September 2023, COTA was awarded **2.3 million dollars** through the Federal Transit Administration for the overall operating assistance and program administration to continue to expand its public transportation services in the CNMI.
- On September 28-29, 2023, COTA held its Annual Professional Development Day. This training included overviews of all policies and procedures for each section within the program.

Revenue And Expenses


COTA's revenue includes federal funding from the U.S. Department of Transportation: Federal Trasnit Admnistration and the farebox collection received from the community and partnering agencies utilizing public transportation. Agencies and establishments such as Commonwealth Health Care Corporation, Center for Living Independent, and Office of Vocational Rehabilitation.

The total expenditures for FY 2023 amounted to **\$344,935.25** to support COTA's program administration and operating assistance. Please refer to the pie chart below for reference.

In addition, COTA' s program income account had a significant increase of **61.87**% revenue collected in the amount of \$67,969.00 for FY 2023 vs. FY 2022 which was at \$41,989.10. Please refer to the bar graph below for reference.




COTA Program Income Account FY 2022 vs. FY 2023


Ferry Feasibility Study and Transportation Masterplan



COTA was awarded **\$800,000.00** U.S. through Department of Transit Transportation, Federal Administration (FTA): Areas of Persistent Poverty Program to conduct independent ferry an feasibility study and transportation masterplan for Saipan, Tinian, and Rota.

COTA will begin working on the solicitation process in FY 2024.

Bus Transfer Stations



COTA was awarded **\$900,000.00** through the Fiscal Year 2023 Appropriations Act for Bus Transfer Stations at the proposed locations:

- Garapan, Saipan
- Northern Marianas College
- Kagman Mobil Station

Acquisition of Ten (10) ADA Accessible Buses

On June 2023, the Commonwealth Office of Transit Authority (COTA) received ten (10) ADA Accessible Transit Buses to support the upcoming Fixed Route Service on the island of Saipan. COTA anticipates to launch its Fixed Route Service in FY2024.



Bus Shelters

COTA was awarded \$4.5 million through the Fiscal Year 2023 Appropriations Act for the 187 Bus Shelters for the re-launch of the Fixed Route system in Saipan, CNMI.

COTA is working closely with the Department of Public Works regarding the possible placements of these shelters along Beach Road.







Solar Covered Parking

COTA was awarded \$3.0 million through the Fiscal Year 2023 Appropriations Act for bus covered parking at COTA's newly built Administrative Building and Maintenance Facility in Lower Base, Saipan

Electric Vehicles

COTA was awarded \$2,373,645.00 through the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) Low or No Emission Grant Program for the acquisition of electric vehicles for the CNMI.

COTA is currently working closely with the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC), Energy Task Force, and other government entities to discuss the acquisition of electric vehicles and charging stations on the island of Saipan. The publication and solicitation is anticipated to start in FY 2024.
