The CNMI Medicaid Program is a Federal-State program, administered by the State and funded by both Federal and State's revenues. The program was implemented in 1979 and was created as Title XIX of the Social Security Act in 1965. The Federal government regulates and monitors funding, eligibility standards, quality, and the scope of medical services. In 1989, the CNMI was granted a waiver making eligibility based only on income and resources, creating the Medical Assistance for the Needy Program (MAN). In 2020, Public Law (PL) 21-28 established the Commonwealth Medicaid Agency (CMA) as a separate agency under the Office of the Governor. PL 21-28 calls for the CMA to implement Medicaid Enterprise Systems (MES) modules, including a Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS), medical claims and clinical data warehouse for Medicaid needs and a community health record system

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to provide patients with access to their health information. The law also states that CMA must establish a Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU) and submit data to the Transformed Medicaid Statistical Information System (T-MSIS).


CHIP Continuous Eligibility (CE)

U.S. Public Law (PL) 117–328, Section 5112 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act 2023 (CAA), amended titles XIX and XXI of the Social Security Act to require that the states and the U.S. territories provide 12 months of Continuous Eligibility (CE) for children under the age of 19 regardless of changes in circumstances with certain exceptions.

The CNMI submitted State Plan Amendment (SPA) 24-0002 to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to implement the requirements of PL 117-328, Section 5112. SPA 24-0002 was approved on May 1, 2024, with an effective date of January 1, 2024.
